

Citizen Advisory Committees

Code #186.00

The Tri-County Area School District Board of Education recognizes the invaluable assistance which can be gained for the entire District from citizens through their input and cooperation.

Therefore, citizen committees may be organized by the Board to serve as advisory groups for the school system. The following three (3) principles shall be considered when establishing citizen committees:

1. Citizen committees should be broadly representative.
2. Recommendations should be based on research and facts.
3. Recommendations should be submitted to the Board which alone has the authority to act upon such recommendations.

The Board shall consider all recommendations made by citizen committees, however, shall reserve the right to accept or reject such recommendations.

An advisory committee shall be dissolved after it has presented recommendations to the Board.

Consistent with the requirements of state law, all meetings of committees shall comply with the Wisconsin Open Meeting Law.
