Special Curriculum Projects

The Tri-County Area School District Board of Education encourages action research in the form of experimental and pilot projects.

Experimental and/or pilot projects may be recommended by staff members or curriculum committees. Experimental programs may be established in the area of instruction if approved by the principal of the building in which the program will be instituted and the District Administrator. If the research is other than routine, it must also be approved by the Board's Curriculum & Program Planning Committee. Proposals are to include plans for evaluation of the program.

After thorough evaluation, a successful experimental program may be submitted to the Board for consideration as a standard program.

All instructional materials, including teachers' manuals, educational websites, videos, and supplementary material, used in connection with any research or experimental program will be available for inspection by the parent(s) or guardian(s) of the children in the program. As used here, "research or experimental program" means any program or project designed to explore or develop new content or unproven teaching methods or techniques.
