

Student Conduct Rules

1. Students shall adhere to District policy regarding student alcohol/drug use, including the prohibition of the purchase. Violators will be sent home at student/parent expense.
2. The parent of any student carrying prescribed medication will be required to inform the staff member in charge, in writing, in advance of the trip, of any type of medication and instructions of its use.
3. Students caught smoking, using tobacco, or in possession of tobacco products will be disciplined.
4. Any games which involve the exchange of money or other items of value shall be prohibited.
5. Students on extended trips who wish to visit relatives and/or friends along the way shall meet with them where the group is assembled. Written parental approval will be required in advance of the trip departure.
6. Evening curfew hours will be strictly enforced.
7. All participants are considered members of the student body, regardless if they have reached their 18th birthday, transferred from another school or graduated, and will adhere to all rules.
8. There is to be **no visiting in hotel rooms** between boys and girls at any time, unless a chaperone is present.
9. Vulgar language is not be use used.
10. Communication to home with cell phones must be with permission from the chaperone. All other cell phone use is prohibited without chaperone permission.
11. Students will be personally and financially responsible for any willful destruction or loss of property.
12. Students must keep the hotel room assigned to them.

If there are any serious infractions and/or repeated violations of the rules of conduct, student handbook or rules set forth by the travel agency, the student will be sent home at the parent's expense. This decision will be made by the head advisor, following a conference with all chaperones and student(s) involved, and the parents/guardians will be notified. Refunds, if any, of the unused portion of the trip will be discussed with the tour company agency. The District will not pay any costs of the trip including any costs involved in sending a student home. These are minimal rules. Additional rules may be added for each individual trip as required.
