

In-School Suspension

Code #447.31

A Tri-County Area School District student may be suspended in school for conduct outlined under Board policy and state law. A student will only be suspended if it is determined that he/she is guilty of noncompliance with a school rule, is defiant, and the in-school suspension is justified. In-school suspensions may be used in grades K-12.

Students suspended in school shall be supervised by specifically delegated and assigned school personnel. School secretaries shall not serve as in-school supervisors except on an intermittent basis during the day when the assigned in-school supervisor must be relieved of his/her supervision for a short period of time

The parent or guardian of a student placed in in-school suspension shall be contacted/notified of an assigned in-school suspension prior to the in-school suspension being enforced.

A student suspended in school shall be allowed to make up any examination or class work missed during the in-school suspension period in accordance with the District's student attendance policy and procedures.

A record of in-school suspensions shall be maintained by the Principal. A record of a student placed on in-school suspension shall be placed in the student's cumulative file.
