

Section 400: Students

Student Dress Code

Code #443.01

It is the policy of the Tri-County Area School District that clothing, accessories (head gear, lunch buckets, tote bags, back packs, etc.) and tattoos worn by students shall not be vulgar, unclean, offensive, obscene, gang-related, excessively torn, and/or sexually explicit, nor interfere with the orderly operation and educational mission of the District. Shirts and skirt/trousers, sweat pants or shorts of appropriate length are to be worn at all times in the school building and on school grounds. Any apparel that promotes tobacco, drugs, alcohol, harassment, is sexually explicit, derogatory or deemed inappropriate is prohibited on school property at any time or at any school-sponsored event either home or away. No midriff or underwear/undergarments shall be exposed. Clothing such as muscle shirts, tube tops, halter tops, and spaghetti straps are not allowed.

Students will not be allowed to wear caps, bandanas or other headgear or outdoor apparel such as jackets or coats in school. Students shall remove jackets and headgear very soon after entering the school building and place them in their lockers. Jackets and headgear are not to be with the student in classrooms during class time or other locations in the building during regularly scheduled school hours unless authorized by the Principal. Students disobeying or violating this policy shall be subject to disciplinary action.
